# First Aid for Poisoning

#### **Swallowed Poison:**

- Gently wipe out mouth and give a small amount of water.
- Do not make the person vomit.
- Call the poison center.

### Poison on the Skin:

- Remove contaminated clothing and jewelry.
- Rinse skin with lukewarm water for 10 minutes.
- Call the poison center.

### Poison in the Eye:

- Flush the eye with lukewarm water from cup, faucet, or shower for 15 minutes.
- Do not force the eyelid open.
- Call the poison center.

### **Inhaled Poison:**

- Get the person to fresh air.
- Open doors and windows.
- Call the poison center.

# What you need to know about Medicine Disposal

Taking medicines to permanent drop-off locations or take back events is the safest way to dispose of them. Many local police departments serve as permanent medicine drop-off locations in Maryland. If you are unable to do the above, here's another safe disposal method.

# Follow these simple steps to dispose of medicines in the household trash

### MIX

Mix medicines (do not crush tablets or capsules) with an unpalatable substance such as dirt, kitty litter, or used coffee ground.

## **PLACE**

Place the mixture **in a container** such as a sealed plastic bag.



# **THROW**

Throw the container in your household trash.



## **SCRATCH OUT**

Scratch out **all personal information** on the prescription label of your empty pill bottle or empty medicine packaging to make it unreadable, then dispose of the container.
