2. Analgesics (pain relievers)
3. Foreign bodies
4. Household cleaning products
5. Topical medicines (for the skin)
6. *(tie)* Antihistamines
  - Antimicrobials
  - Plants
  - Vitamins
10. Gastrointestinal medicines (for the stomach)

**Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:**

1. Foreign bodies
2. Cosmetics and personal care products
3. *(tie)* Analgesics (pain relievers)
  - Antidepressants
5. *(tie)* Antihistamines
  - Antimicrobials
  - Cold and cough medicines
8. *(tie)* Arts and crafts products
  - Gastrointestinal medicines (for the stomach)
  - Sleep medicines and antipsychotics

**Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:**

1. Analgesics (pain relievers)
2. Household cleaning products
3. Heart medicines
4. Cosmetics and personal care products
5. Fumes/vapors/gases
6. Chemicals
7. *(tie)* Anticholinergic medicines
  - Bites and stings
  - Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
10. Antidepressants
