1. Foreign bodies
2. Cosmetics and personal care products
3. Household cleaning products
4. Analgesics (pain relievers)
5. Antihistamines
6. *(tie)* Deodorizers  
    Topical medicines (for the skin)
8. Plants
9. Arts and crafts products
10. *(tie)* Cold and cough medicines  
    Heart medicines

**Most common exposures, children 6-19 years:**

1. *(tie)* Analgesics (pain relievers)  
    Cold and cough medicines
3. Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
4. *(tie)* Antihistamines  
    Plants
6. *(tie)* Antidepressants  
    Cosmetics and personal care products  
    Heart medicines  
    Household cleaning products

**Most common exposures, adults 20 years and older:**

1. Heart medicines
2. Household cleaning products
3. *(tie)* Analgesics (pain relievers)  
    Sleep medicines and antipsychotics
5. Antidepressants
6. Anticonvulsants
7. Hormones (including antidiabetic and thyroid medicines)
8. Fumes/vapors/gases
